## JDRS Stands up!


On 5 May, the Navy/Marine team successfully converted from the Naval Aviation Discrepancy Reporting Program (NAMDRP) to the Joint Deficiency Reporting System (JDRS).

Along with the Navy/Marine transition, the Army's Aviation and Missile command successfully converted to JDRS from their legacy application, the Electronic Deficiency Reporting System (EDRS).

The Air Force will begin the transition from their legacy application, the Deficiency Reporting and Investigating System (DRIS), to JDRS beginning 23 June.

JDRS training for the Defense Contract Management Agency (DCMA) is underway led by the national JDRS Clearinghouse team.

Announcement of the launch of JDRS at the June briefing to the Joint Aeronautical Logistics Commanders (JALC) generated numerous accolades and high praise from 3-star senior leadership complimenting the JDRS team on their success. The commanders responded stating:
